

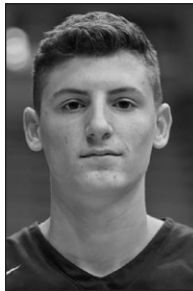
Southridge scissors 5-game skid in finale

BOONVILLE — The waiting is over.

Southridge snapped its five-game skid on Thursday, picking up a 48-39 win at Boonville in the regular-season finale. The Raiders (9-14) had not won a game since Jan. 25 at North Posey, but they closed things out on a high note with their lone win during February.

They trailed, 14-9, after the first quarter, and 34-33 after three periods, but outscored the Pioneers, 15-5, in the final quarter. Junior Colson Montgomery came through for Southridge, posting a game-

high 26 points. Southridge nailed a pair of 3-pointers, both of which came from Montgomery. He also went 6 for 8 at the free throw line. The Raiders are two wins away from their second sectional championship in three years. Southridge awaits the winner of Tuesday's first-round match between Pocket Athletic Conference rivals Forest Park and South Spencer. The Raiders have a bye into the March 6 semifinal at their own Huntingburg Memorial Gym.

Patberg scores 26 to pace No. 22 Indiana

BLOOMINGTON — Ali Patberg had 26 points, five rebounds and four assists to help No. 22 Indiana beat Nebraska 81-53 on Thursday night.

Patberg made a 3-pointer at the end of the third quarter to extend Indiana's lead to 50-41, and the Hoosiers started the fourth on a 23-4 run, making all four of their 3-pointers. Patberg was coming off a 29-point performance in a win over Minnesota on Saturday to earn her third Big Ten player of the week award. Grace Berger added 15 points, seven

rebounds and six assists for Indiana (22-7, 12-5). Aleksa Gulbe and Mackenzie Holmes scored 11 points apiece. Senior Brenna Wise scored three points in Indiana's final home game of the season. Patberg scored seven points in the first half as Indiana led 33-27. Leigha Brown led Nebraska (17-12, 7-11) with 22 points. She was 7 of 12 from the field but the rest of her teammates combined to shoot 10 for 49 (20%).

CLARIFICATION

In a story Thursday about John Goebel being named District 2 Coach of the Year, it was incorrectly reported that he won his first sectional championship at Jasper in 2012-13. His first title with the Wildcats was in 2013-14.
