



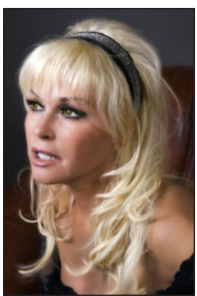

## Lorrie Morgan kicks off Jasper arts season

JASPER — Jasper Community Arts has announced the scheduled for the 2019-20 season. Four

series of performing arts events will showcase 12 performances. Shows in the four series — Main Stage, Backstage, Live @ the Astra and Family — will take place at the Jasper Arts Center and the Astra from September through March.

Jasper Community Arts offers patrons several packages from which to choose. The Grand Package includes tickets to all 12 performances and offers the best per ticket price for each performance. Subscriptions to each of the four series are available. Those who had a subscription during the 2019-18 season will be able to renew their subscription(s) beginning Monday, June 3. New subscriptions may be purchased beginning Monday, July 1.

Beginning Thursday, Aug. 1, individual tickets will be available for purchase online at [www.jasperarts.org](http://www.jasperarts.org). Patrons do not need to buy an entire series to order tickets, but JCA does recommend that tickets be purchased in advance due to demand. Single tickets are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, so interested patrons should order single tickets as soon as possible.

Tickets may purchased four ways:

- In person. Stop by the Jasper Arts Center, 951 College Ave., between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays through Wednesdays and Fridays or 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. Thursdays.

### Main Stage Series

The Main Stage Series will feature five events. Lorrie Morgan opens the season, followed by 6 Guitars, Christmas with The Isaacs, Hiplet Balerinas and Shaun Johnson's Big Bad Experience with Tonic Sol-Fa. Series tickets are \$145 for adults, \$136 for senior citizens and \$124 for students.

### Lorrie Morgan

Saturday, Sept. 28, 7:30 p.m.

One of the most eloquently emotive country vocalists of modern times, Morgan is the first woman in her genre to begin her career with three consecutive Platinum Albums. She has long been the envy of her peers for her lustrous vocal phrasing and the down-to-earth believability of her torchy performances.

Individual tickets are \$40 for adults, \$38 for senior citizens and \$35 for students.

### 6 Guitars

Friday, Nov. 8, 7:30 p.m.

6 Guitars is a pitch-perfect blend of music, comedy and characters. Chase Padgett portrays six different guitar-playing characters, each sharing their own style of music. Each character, from the young rock prodigy to the weary blues picker, shares hilarious anecdotes that only a life of playing music can give.

### Shaun Johnson's Big Band Experience with Tonic Sol-Fa

Saturday, Feb. 22, 7:30 p.m.

Two distinct shows hit the stage for one night. Shaun Johnson's Big Band Experience is a rare newcomer to traditional pop, fusing big band spirit with an inventive edge. Tonic Sol-Fa has established itself not only as the most in-demand vocal group in the Midwest, but also as one of the most successful independent acts in America.

### Backstage Series

The Backstage Series, comprised of three events, features an intimate seating arrangement with audience members most often on stage with the artist for a house concert feel. The season opener will be Winston Churchill: The Blitz, followed by the Goldstein-Peled-Fiterstein Trio and Che Apalache. Series tickets are \$64 for adults, \$59 for senior citizens and \$38 for students. Individual tickets for each of these performances are \$25 per person for adults, \$23 for senior citizens and \$15 for students.

### Goldstein-Peled-Fiterstein Trio

### Che Apalache

Combining instrumental prowess with tight vocal harmonies, they have created an authentic blend of genres to reflect the nature of their lives.
